

Dermatology Mini Audit

The Sonic Healthcare Dermatology Mini Audit will provide participating GPs with the opportunity to review and reflect on their skin cancer surgical practice to assist in refining the diagnostic and collection skills associated with the diagnosis and surgical treatment of skin lesions.

Australia has one of the highest rates of skin cancer in the world, with skin cancers, all types, accounting for 80% of all new cancers diagnosed each year.

Approximately two in three Australians will be diagnosed with skin cancer by the time they are 70 years of age, with more than 750,000 people treated for one or more non-melanoma skin cancers each year. Non-melanoma skin cancer is more common in men, with almost double the incidence compared to women. Excluding non-melanoma skin cancer, melanoma is the third most common cancer in women, the fourth most common cancer in men and the most common cancer in Australians aged 15–44 years. More than 2,000 Australians will die from skin cancer each year.

Work through the online e-learning workshop at your own pace. The format of this course requires GPs to access their surgical log and review 12 recent surgical excisions for skin cancer, complete short answer questions, an evaluation questionnaire, video presentation and suggested readings.

Short answer responses – questions on each of the 12 cases.

Video presentation – GPs can view a video presentation on diagnostic algorithms.

Evaluation questionnaire – reflect on the course upon completion of the Mini Audit.
